# ANN'S HEART & THE CODE BLUE OVERNIGHT EMERGENCY WARMING CENTER

The Code Blue Overnight Emergency Warming Center, located in the social hall below Sacred Heart Church across from the Senior Center in Phoenixville, provides a cold weather, overnight center for men, women and families. According to Chester County regulations, Code Blue is when temperatures dip to 35 degrees or below (considering wind chill factor). This is when the risk of hypothermia, frost bite, or other cold-related injuries could occur if outside for prolonged periods of time.

Ann's Heart believes that whether it is 35 or 38 degrees, it is too cold to sleep outside at night during the winter months. This is why the Code Blue Overnight Emergency Warming Center is open from mid-November to mid-April (depending on the weather for any given year) from 8PM to 8AM, seven days a week, with one paid staff member and up to two volunteers per shift each night. However, during a severe weather event the center may remain open throughout the day to ensure that guests have a safe and warm place to shelter from the storm. The center can accommodate up to 16 guests each night and all guests are welcome as long as they agree to act in a manner that allows us to fulfill our mission of providing a safe and welcoming environment for all.

We offer full and partial scholarships for families who are experiencing financial hardship. No child or teen has ever been turned away from a camp or show cast because of their inability to pay. Throughout the year, Firebird Theatre offers a wide variety of theatre arts programming, which culminates in our summer main stage, full length Broadway musical, complete with a live orchestra. We also provide a series of KIDS and Junior musical theater workshop camps in which our staff will teach elementary and teen casts all aspects of theatre and culminate in a Broadway Junior or KIDS performance. During the school year, Firebird offers a Saturday morning theater workshop series, weekday Acting classes and our Annual Holiday show.

Our highly popular Summer Internship Program provides high school and college students studying the arts, education and business with real-life experience by becoming a part of the production team, working under the supervision of theatre professionals and community leaders.

Our goal is to engage, enrich and equip our youth with all of the skills necessary for staging a theatrical performance: acting, singing, dancing, stage management, building sets, making props and costumes, running

The Phoenix Iron Company Foundry, built in 1882, is home to the Schuylkill River Heritage Center. The Schuylkill River Heritage Center is an historic gateway to northern Chester County that provides information about places of interest to visit throughout the county. It also highlights the Schuylkill River's resources from Pottsville to Philadelphia.

Historic artifacts and large murals showcase the industrial legacy of the Schuylkill River and the former Phoenix Iron and Steel Company. Constantly running videos give visitors a comprehensive overview of the region's resources and its history.

#### PHOENIXVILLE SENIOR CENTER

The Phoenixville Area Senior Center was founded in 1978. The First Presbyterian Church on Main Street rented space to the senior center for its program for 10 years. There it offered a daily luncheon and a few programs for adults over the age of 60. Space was limited and as membership grew, it became necessary to search for a larger facility.

In May of 1986 an opportunity arose to purchase and renovate the Sacred Heart Social Center, a historic building ideal for a senior center. The building was conveniently located near the downtown business district and nearby residential area. Major renovations were needed both to the outside and the inside of the building. After the first phase of the renovations was completed, community volunteers helped to move the center from the First Presbyterian Church to our new building on Church Street. An Open House was held on October 30, 1988, to celebrate the opening of the new center and to allow everyone in the community to visit.

With the new facility, the center was able to increase its programming for seniors. Today, the center welcomes a culturally diverse group of people who spend time at the center involved in a variety of activities. The center now offers exercise classes, art classes, computer classes, a Tech support group, and Wii bowling. Our trip program is very popular for those who like to travel. Breakfast is offered three days a week and lunch is available five days a week. Seniors also enjoy a variety of social events and celebrations

The Phoenixville Area Senior Center continues its tradition to serve, support and enhance the lives of all senior citizens, by providing programs and activities designed to promote active, independent, healthy lifestyles.



### I GraceCrossing Church and Parsonage 248 Church Street

This congregation has a rich heritage of ministry in Phoenixville for more than 185 years. A small group of Phoenixville Baptists organized the church in 1830, 19 years before the Borough of Phoenixville was organized. The current structure was built in 1910 of Pennsylvania marble in English Gothic design. The construction cost was \$3500. Focal points of the sanctuary are the beautiful stained glass windows. Several windows are inscribed with the names of the church forefathers. In 2011 the congregation changed its name from "The Baptist Church of Phoenixville" to "GraceCrossing Community Church."

### GraceCrossing Parsonage

The GraceCrossing Annex and horse sheds (no longer on the property) were built in 1875. Several pastors' families lived in the parsonage until the 1960's. At that time the first floor became the church office and pastor's office. Over the years the second floor has been used for several purposes, including the Phoenixville Area Community Services office, youth pastor's office, small group meeting rooms, food pantry, and church staff housing. Today, this impressive Victorian continues to be used for the church office and pastor's office. In addition, our current pastor and his wife use the kitchen, dining room, and second floor as their home. The McDowalls invite you to see their home here as they serve their congregation and Phoenixville. Please follow the luminaria and enter from the front door to view the original wood staircase in the hallway.

## 2 Peter Urscheler 235 Bridge St

Back by popular demand, this magnificent example of in-town living is the home of Phoenixville's beloved Mayor Peter Urscheler. Among his many talents, Peter currently hosts a television show on Voxipop titled "The Mayor's Kitchen". Be sure to go to the outdoor patio (elevator is available to the upper level) to enjoy the unparalleled 360 degree view of Downtown Phoenixville.



# **3**3 Mill Street

Originally known as "Nailers Row", homes on Mill Street were built in 1847. Built by Phoenix Iron works to house their employees, the architectural style can best be described as Pre-Victorian, Pennsylvania Vernacular. The interior of this charming row home is typical of the period: pie-winder stairs, flared and rounded window surrounds to admit maximum daylight, and exterior walls made of local field stone clad in stucco. All three floors will be open to visitors. Visitors will need to enter via Taylor Alley at the rear of the property and come through the garden gate into the kitchen door. Now that Phoenixville has become a destination, this house is available for rent through AirBnB,com. Most of the paintings in the house were done by the owner, Peter Segal, who has also painted the Dancers mural on the back of the Colonial Theatre, visible from the garden, the Kite Mural on the side of the Iron Hill building, and the Phoenix mural on the side of the Phoenix Village Apartments. Mill Street is to Phoenixville what Elfreth's Alley is to Philadelphia.



## 4 Artifaqt 15 Main Street

Built in 1930, this cornerstone structure once served as Phoenixville's original post office, a cigar shoppe, and yes, a speakeasy! Furnishings for Disney have been made here for several years. Now also the home of Artifaqt Market, the new market features unique, hand made serving and cooking pieces. Tapas tastings occur here frequently.



# **5**335 Church Street

Originally constructed in 1890, this home is now an artist's haven with the studio on the third flood. Fully restored inside with original brick walls, the property has a splendid view of downtown from the rear. The ideal close-to-downtown lifestyle combining the old with the new.



# **6**Senior Center 153 Church Street

Dating back to 1875 this historic treasure was once the social hall of Sacred Heart Church. Full details can be found in the Senior Center Beneficiary description.

# **7**323 Gay Street




# **8**319 Second Avenue

Built circa 1900, when local area stone was in abundance, this Victorian twin and its counterparts were dominant structures in early Phoenixville. Ironically, this is the original home of Dan Phillips, Tour Co-Chair, where he grew up!











# 9302 Main Street

Dating back to 1855, this Victorian Gothic is being lovingly restored one room at a time and the owners invite you to not only see their work to date, but hear their future plans. There are exposed original brick walls in two of the rooms. Both the first and second floors will be on display. Visitors may also access the back yard if they would like. The original builder and first owner built many of the other homes in Phoenixville.



# 10328 Fourth Avenue

This large, inviting home built in 1906 provides room for a growing family. Enjoy seeing original woodwork throughout, tin ceilings, crystal chandeliers (two of which are original) a Butler's pantry, stained glass, and even a door tram bearing the inscription "Patented 1890"). An added attraction is the large enclosed front porch reminiscent of a bygone era.



### 11 401 South Street

You have always told us that the blank canvas of a home recently renovated is a tour favorite, and this one is sure to please. Let your imagination flourish as you envision your own touch here.






